The undersigned, upon information and belief, complains

COUNT 01

On or about September 7, 2010, a violation of Section 415(2) of the California Penal Code, a misdemeanor, was committed by DONALD JAMES MYERS, who maliciously and willfully disturbed another person by loud and unreasonable noise.

COUNT 02

On or about September 7, 2010, a violation of Section 602(o) of the California Penal Code, a misdemeanor, was committed by DONALD JAMES MYERS, who refused or failed to leave land, real property, or structures belonging to or lawfully occupied by another and not open to the general public, upon being requested to leave by the owner, the owner's agent, the person in lawful possession, or a peace officer acting upon request from any of these individuals.

COUNT 03

On or about August 4, 2010, a violation of Section 602(o) of the California Penal Code, a misdemeanor, was committed by DONALD JAMES MYERS, who refused or failed to leave land, real property, or structures belonging to or lawfully occupied by another and not open to the general public, upon being requested to leave by the owner, the owner's agent, the person in lawful possession, or a peace officer acting upon request from any of these individuals.

On or about September 7, 2010, a violation of Section 415.5(a) of the California Penal Code, a misdemeanor, was committed by DONALD JAMES MYERS, who maliciously and willfully disturbed another person within any building or upon the grounds of a school, community college, university, or state university by loud and unreasonable noise.

COUNT 07

On or about August 4, 2010, a violation of Section 626.8(1) of the California Penal Code, a misdemeanor, was committed by DONALD JAMES MYERS, who came into a school building or onto school grounds, or onto a street, sidewalk, or public way adjacent thereto, without lawful business. Defendant's presence interfered with the peaceful conduct of the activities of the school or disrupted the school or its pupils, and defendant failed to leave the described premises after being asked to leave by the chief administrative official of the school or by his or her designated representative, or by a person employed as a member of a security or police department of a school district, or by a police officer.


COUNT 08

REQUEST FOR DISCOVERY

Pursuant to Section 1054.3 of the Penal Code, the People hereby request that the defendant and his or her attorney provide the following:

(a) The names and addresses of persons, other than the defendant, he or she intends to call as witnesses at trial, together with any relevant written or recorded statements of those persons, or reports of the statements of those persons, including any reports or statements of experts made in connection with the case, and including the results of physical or mental examinations, scientific test, experiments, or comparisons which the defendant intends to offer in evidence at the trial.

(b) Any real evidence which the defendant intends to offer at the trial.

Please provide the requested items within 15 days of the defendant's arraignment. This is a continuing request; any items which are obtained or become known to the defense more than fifteen days after arraignment are to be provided to the People as soon as practicable.

NOTICE PURSUANT TO PENAL CODE SECTIONS 296 AND 296.1

NOTICE: Conviction of this offense will require the Defendant to provide DNA samples and print impressions pursuant to Penal Code sections 296 and 296.1 if the Defendant has suffered a prior felony conviction. Willful refusal to provide the samples is a crime.

NOTICE: Defendant is required to provide DNA samples and print impressions pursuant to Penal Code sections 296 and 296.1 if the Defendant is currently on probation or parole and has suffered a prior felony conviction. Willful refusal to provide the samples is a crime.
